

# Quilters by the Sea Challenge Quilt 2016

- ❖ The challenge quilt this year is "Circle of Friends ".
- ❖ The quilts can be 12-18 inches in diameter (circular quilt).
- ❖ The finish of edges may be any technique you like.
- ❖ The embellishments are used in judging as well as use of theme.
- ❖ You may use any and all techniques in fabric art for this challenge.
- ❖ As in prior years, there will be awards.
- Please have your quilts in a labeled pillow case at the February guild meeting to meet the deadline.

#### January 25:

Our program will be "My Adventures down the Rabbit Hole" with Michelle May. Michelle recently joined our Guild and it is wonderful that she is willing to share her quilting loves and experiences with us! We have seen her beautiful wool work at quilt shows. And I suspect there will be a few rabbit stories as well!! The program will be a combination of trunk show and lecture. AND she has also agreed to teach us one of her classes on May 21. #### February 22:

Our program will be "Asian Fusion Designs for Quilters – Welcome to the Year of the Monkey" with Mari Yamashita de Moya. Mari has also recently joined our Guild and jumped right in to host the Christmas Party and what fun we had! Many fabric lines now produce a variety of Asian inspired cotton fabric for quilters – and designs and patterns for quilts with Asian motifs are readily available. Mari melds her education background in Asian and Pacific art and 46 years of quilting experience to share some ideas so you can create original quilt designs with Asian influences with confidence. Mari and her husband Rick

relocated last year to Wilmington, NC after a brief stay in Chapel Hill, and Mari continues to commute once a week to Chapel Hill to complete a certification in Botanical Illustration at the North Carolina Botanical Garden.

#### March 28:

Our program will be "Barn Quilts and the American Quilt Trail Movement" with Suzi Parron. Suzi will be taking us on a journey along the quilt trail – a wonderful collection of hundreds of painted quilts. The presentation will be a combination of slides and lecture. In our **Barn Quilt class**, we will be making a 2 foot by 2 foot painted barn quilt suitable to hang on a small building. Class should last about 3 hours, and you leave with a finished (or pretty close!) quilt block! Supplies and patterns will be furnished. Sign up information will be in the Kitchen area at both Jan and February program meetings. Class will be held March 28 at church. Cost is \$25, payable when you sign up. Since the class is 3 hours, we could fit in 2 classes if needed. Times will be determined by the number of classes.




# Crown and Star

This makes a 16" block



\*\* Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block \*\*



Cut the Color 1 2-1/2" x 18" strip into four 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles. Then cut the Color 1 5" x 20" strip into sixteen 2-1/2" squares. Next cut the Color 1 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip into four 2-7/8" squares. Stack the 2-7/8" squares and cut in half once on the diagonal to make eight Half Square Triangles...



Now cut the Color 2 5" x 18" strip into eight 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles. Next cut the Color 2 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip into four 2-7/8" squares. Stack the 2-7/8" squares and cut in half once on the diagonal to make eight Half Square Triangles. Cut the Color 2 4-1/2" x 18" strip into four 4-1/2" squares. Lastly cut the Color 2 2-1/2" x 30" strip into twelve 2-1/2" squares...


(...whew... now you can take a cutting break and have a cuppa tea!)



Shown here enlarged, sew pairs of Color 1 and Color 2 Half Square Triangles right sides together into Half Squares using a 1/4" seam allowance. Press seams to the darker sides. You'll be making eight of these Half Squares, which should measure 2-1/2"..




Next we'll make the Flying Geese units shown above. To do this, place a Color 1 2-1/2" square right sides together atop a Color 2 rectangle, with outer edges aligned. (I show them staggered, yours shouldn't be) On the back of the top square lightly mark the diagonal. Sew on this diagonal marking. Cut off the excess seam allowance. Press the remainder towards the corner. Repeat this with another Color 1 square on the other end of the rectangle. Make eight geese in the same manner. These should measure 2-1/2" x 4-1/2"




To piece the block's side units sew four of the units shown at left...

Piece one of the units shown at left to make the block's center unit, using the extra Color 1 4-1/2" square we cut as the middle square...



Now lay out all the units you've made as shown at left. Sew three horizontal rows, pressing row seams in alternating directions. Join the three rows to finish your block!



Here are four blocks by five with 4-1/2" sashing strips, then two borders that same width and one 2-1/2" wide border. Happy Quilting Folks!

<u>Color 2 needs</u>: one 5" x 18" strip AND one 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip AND one 4-1/2" x 18" strip AND one 2-1/2" x 30" strip
